# **Letters to the Editor**

One of the things I love about our liberal religion is the freedom to hold views that some might not agree with. I find myself thinking about our focus on inmate rights, death penalty issues and re-entry issues and the great work that we have put into supporting these efforts. In thinking about these issues I feel we

need to offer a balance of victim centered issues as well. While some may feel these are opposing views, I feel they should be considered in tandem. Victims frequently state they want the "life lessons" learned so someone else does not have to experience the same pains they are coping with. Since the issues we have discussed frequently focus on the humanity of inmates or offenders, these are more common wishes for all. Please consider the crime victim views as well when raising an offender centered concern. Victims and survivors experience many forms of social isolation as a result of the crime and we should provide the same safe place to discuss their concerns as well as we do for offenders. You might be surprised to hear the victim services available in our community are just as limited if not more than those for offenders. Could we become part of the solution? Kerry McElwee
