Dear Ones at UUCD,

I'm so thrilled that I don't even know how to contain myself. Please know that I couldn't be happier to be joining you as your new Minister. We'll get to know one another soon enough, but just so you know a bit about me... I've been an ordained minister for about 17 years, mostly in the Metropolitan Community Churches, which is a denomination founded in 1968 with a specific outreach to LGBTQ+ folks. I've been working with the UUA in partnership for all of those years, more intentionally in the last 8 that I've been on denominational staff, and more still the last 1+ years that I've been seeking dual credentials with the UUA (and maintaining my MCC standing). I live in Rehoboth Beach with my wife, who is unapologetically Canadian, and a minister herself for over 25 years. She is the pastor of MCC Rehoboth. We have a 6 pound dog, Kady, and a 15 pound cat, Téa. We have lived in Delaware for 3 years now and love it so much.

Since I transitioned from a local congregational minister to a church bureaucrat, I have missed being in relationship with real people, with real issues, in a local community where people are actually doing the work of love and justice, and forming community. I'm thrilled to be joining you now. One of the things I need to tell you is that I am SO impressed with your lay leadership. What an amazing congregation, that you have such a committed, gifted group of people who are passionate about the values of Unitarian Universalism and offering a progressive faith voice in Delaware. I'm humbled by all of the dedication your leaders give. You have the "human resources" of a MUCH larger organization, and you should feel very proud about that.

While I know we will get to know one another over this next year, I want you to know that I respect you so much already, and I expect to learn a lot from you. At the same time, I hope some of my experience might benefit you. Mostly, I hope we will learn, laugh, and love together. No question you might ask me is out of bounds, and I expect the same of the questions and curiosities I may have about you.

Volunteers of all ages can help make a difference by participating in the 32nd annual Delaware Coastal Cleanup on **Saturday**, **September 14**, **2019**. The clean-up will be from 9:00 a.m. to noon. In case of severe weather, the rain date will be Saturday, September 21. The annual coastal cleanup is sponsored by the Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control. It spans the First State's 97-mile eastern coastline and includes river and ocean shorelines as well as wetland and watershed areas. In 2018, despite a weather-related delay, more than a thousand volunteers collected 2.7 tons of trash and recyclables from 42 sites along more than 68 miles of Delaware's waterways and coastline. Suggested Readings: Teachings on Love by Thich Nhat Hanh and Lovingkindness: the Revolutionary Art of Happiness by Sharon Salzburg

In this 6-session class, we will explore cultivating true love in our lives and in our relationships through the practice of mindfulness. We will have readings, and activities to strengthen our practice of mindfulness. We will learn and study the 4 elements of True Love: loving kindness, compassion, joy, and equanimity or inclusiveness. Each class will include a guided meditation, a teaching, an interactive activity, and time for discussion and sharing.
